Exams.

Midterms. There will be two in-class midterms, respectively on February 19th and April 2nd.

Final. There will be a three-hour final examination at the end of the term. The time and date is organized by the university and it will be announced in class later in the semester.

No calculators are allowed during the exams.

Exam Policy.

Midterm. Makeups will not be given for midterms. Students can only be excused from the exams because of serious illness or a family emergency of comparable gravity; you will need a note from your doctor or dean.

Final. All students must take the final examination at the time scheduled by the University. The only exception is for students who have another scheduled examination at the same time, or three scheduled examinations on the same calendar day. If this is the case, inform the instructors in all relevant courses no less than two weeks before the exam. Final examinations cannot be rescheduled because of travel arrangements.
